Terms of the competition:

Eligible are German and international duos consisting of a melody instrument and concert guitar.

Keyboard instruments, harp, membranophones, electronic instruments and vocals as well as guitar duos are not admitted.

The age limit is 35 years (deadline: 17.10.2025). 20 duos will be invited; admission is determined by the date of receipt of the registration documents and the registration fee. Waiting list possible. Registration deadline: 15.07.2025.

Incomplete applications will not be considered.

The competition is open to the public.

Prices

A total of 24,500 euros is available.

- 1st prize € 10.000,-
- 2nd prize € 7.500,-
- 3rd prize € 5.000,-
- Special prizes up to a total of € 2,000

Participation in the closing event is mandatory for the awarding of prizes.

Program requirements

The competition runs over three rounds. At the end of a scoring round, the jury will decide who will go on to the next round. The decision will be announced on the evening of the judging day.

The program must not be repeated in subsequent rounds.

It is preferable to perform original literature.

Program and line-up changes are possible until 15.09.2025. Changes after this date will result in disqualification.

1st round - total playing time 15-18 minutes

- *Compulsory work:*
 - 3 movements from Gustav Gunsenheimer Sonata No. 2 for solo instrument and guitar

• Compulsory additional free program

2nd round - total playing time 20 - 25 minutes

Two compulsory elective works:

• a complete work or complete movement of serious new music (no folklore)

AND

• a complete work or complete movement composed before 1850

A free program can also be added.

Final - total playing time 25 - 35 minutes

- free program in compliance with the following guidelines:
 - o a complete, multi-movement work must be included
 - Works from at least two different eras

The program selection for the finale should follow the format of a classical concert of serious music. Care should be taken to select works that do justice to the musical character of the respective instrumentation.

Procedure:

The schedule depends on the number of participants and will be announced after the registration deadline. If the competition is fully booked, the following schedule is planned:
